

Just the thing for a celebration, Bubble and Squeak from The Wee Cookbook, found in a recent move. It does squeak in the skillet! 3 T butter, 1 small onion diced, 2 C shredded cooked cabbage, 2 C mashed potatoes. Saute onions in butter till tender. Combine cabbage and potatoes. Add to skillet and press with fork to form a cake. Cook over moderate heat till well browned. Loosen potato cake with spatula and flip, cook till browned. Cut into wedges, add cheese, sour cream or other addition....


