year.


Leah Ward-Lee. U.S. Army (Ret.). Author of \$1,000 Startups: 60 Businesses for Micro-Entrepreneurs.


Bill Leonardi. U.S. Navy (Ret.). Author of *Dancing Through* the Maze.

came to write it all out, how they did it, and why.






