


August 2023 Newsletter

Veterans Event At Story & Song Center for Arts & Culture

We're excited to introduce our Local Veteran Authors who will be featured in our fall event. Come and learn how these veterans were inspired to write and publish in their various genres. This lively discussion is of interest not only to writers, but to the general public as well.

Retired U.S. Army Major General Mari K. Eder, moderator of our event, is a renowned speaker and author. A thought leader on strategic communication and leadership, General Eder has served as Director of Public Affairs at the George C. Marshall European Center for Security Studies, and as an adjunct professor at the NATO School and Sweden's International Training Command. She held senior positions at the Pentatgon, on the Army Staff, as Deputy Chief of Public Affairs and Deputy Chief of the Army Reserve, and with DoD's Reserve Forces Policy Board. General Eder speaks and writes frequently on communication topics at universities and for international audiences.

General Eder launches her latest book at 3 pm, with our writers event to follow. She last visited the island with *The Girls Who Stepped Out of*

Line: Stories of Courage, Sacrifice, and Grit – the Women of WWII. Ever since then, we've wanted to get her back here! She will launch The Girls Who Fought Crime: The Untold True Story of the Country's First Female Investigator and Her Crime Fighting Squad.


Local Author Book Signing This Month
