

# \*Details for February 27, 2024-- Mock Pitch Session, facilitated & organized by Rachel Glover

From our July Focus Group, a program on T**he Pitch** received the most votes. You asked and it is happening. Visit Rachel's website at <u>https://www.4pocalypsearts.com</u>. Scroll to her Blog, read Parts 1-8 about Traditional Publishing. This gives a brief guide to the traditional publishing process, but also gives links to articles from experts, such as expert Jane Friedman. Part 8 explains the pitch session. #### PITCH SESSIONS

Writers find the table assigned to the literary agent or editor with whom they signed up for their pitch.

Each pitch session is fifteen minutes. A volunteer keeps time and announces each change as needed.

For five minutes, the "agents" will review the writer's query letter and synopsis. At the end of the five minutes, a volunteer announces that writers can go to the "agents."

For the remaining ten minutes, the writers will sit in front of the "agents" and give their elevator pitches and business cards. "Agents" will have an opportunity to ask questions about the material, as well as give the writers feedback on their material. Writers should be ready to answer questions related to their novels.

If you are considering giving a pitch at a conference to an agent, this is your chance to practice. It helps!
