

During the interval between his working years and golden years, Tom has transitioned from a career as a copywriter and creative director in ad agency settings, to freelance creative maven—to writing fiction.

He is the author of five novels, four of which are set to varying degrees on or around Amelia Island, Fla. The first novel, his initial foray into fiction, is set primarily in Heaven.

"I was, in turn, humbled and awestruck by the artistry and lyricism of John Doerr's prose in *All The Light We Cannot See*. Then inspired. I'd run across a small corner of history in Tidewater Virginia. Mathews, Va. was home to an inordinate concentration of merchant seamen. Those merchant seamen suffered disproportionately in World War II when German U-boats began sinking dozens of ships off the U.S. East Coast and the North Atlantic.

The inspiration led to a new novel, *LifeLine*, which is the story of how World War II engulfs families from both sides of the Atlantic in the inevitability of its violence and trauma. Members of those families are driven by the fates into deadly encounters that exact a grievous price from their households."

A Bowl of Chicken Soup

Two years ago, a friend suggested that I send stories for CHICKEN SOUP FOR THE SOUL, which is a series of themed books, each with about 101 short stories.

For submissions, the stories must relate to the theme, be true, written in first person, and can have up to1200 words. In the past, I've sent stories about family, work, pets, weather, life and death. Some stories were funny, others sad; some were frivolous and others serious. Due to the vast number of stories submitted for each theme, it can be a long time before any response is received. The first story I sent, took so long I had forgotten and thought they were crediting me with somebody else's work.

I had one story in their book published in July 2024. This year, four of my stories were accepted in three different books. One story released February 2025, another coming in April, and two stories will appear in their May publication.

FYI- Chicken Soup for the Soul will pay \$250 per published story and give the author ten copies per story.
